**CONSENT ORDER**

Based on a complaint filed with the Louisiana Licensed Professional Counselors Board of Examiners (the Board), and consistent with its authority and duty to safeguard the public pursuant to the Louisiana Mental Health Counselor Act (La. R.S. 37:1101, et seq.), known as “the Counselor Act,” and rules regarding disciplinary proceedings (LAC 46:LX.1301, et seq.), the Board enters into the following Consent Order (LAC 46:LX.1311, et seq.), with the licensee, Leslye Hunter.

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

1. Leslye Hunter is a Licensed Professional Counselor and a Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist engaged in the practice of counseling and marriage and family therapy in the State of Louisiana as evidenced by license No. 1995 (LPC) and MFT 146 (LMFT) issued by the Louisiana Licensed Professional Counselors Board of Examiners, Baton Rouge, Louisiana;
2. Ms. Hunter was previously actively engaged in the practice of counseling in Metairie, Louisiana;
3. The complainant is Toby Chauvin.
4. Ms. Hunter admits to the following:

- a.) that she did not provide appropriate establishment, disclosure and explanation of changes regarding fees related to Mr. Chauvin's record, in violation of LPC Code of Conduct Rules §2103. J.1. and 2.; §2118.A.10.; and LMFT Code of Ethics §4717. A., C.1. And 4., E.G.; and §4720.A.10.c.
- b.) that she transferred Mr. Chauvin's case records without assuring protection of those records, in violation of LPC Code of Conduct Rule §2105. D.1. and 4.
- c.) that she transferred Mr. Chauvin's case to another therapist unprofessionally, in violation of LPC Code of Conduct §2103. A.1., and K.1.; and LMFT Code of Ethics §4705. A., K., L.; §4707. F., G.; and §4709 J.

### **SANCTION**

Based on the admissions contained herein, the Board finds that Leslye Hunter has violated the LPC Code of Conduct and the LMFT Code of Ethics as listed above; therefore, the Board requires that Leslye Hunter acquire five continuing education units in the content area of fee disclosure, record keeping, termination with clients and transferring clients to other therapists.

In addition, Leslye Hunter accepts an official letter of reprimand that the Board will issue for the above listed LPC Code of Conduct and LMFT Code of Ethics violations.

Leslye Hunter specifically acknowledges that failure to comply with the terms of this Consent Agreement and Order may result in a suspension or revocation of her Louisiana Licensed Professional Counselor's License including responsibility for all applicable penalties and sanctions. The admissions contained herein, will be considered proven and the only issue will be failure to follow the terms of this Consent Agreement and Order. By agreeing to the terms of this Consent Agreement and Order Ms Hunter waives all rights to appeal this adjudication and any of the conditions set above.

WHEREFORE, pursuant to the Louisiana Mental Health Counselor Act (the "Counseling Act," Title 37:1101, et seq.), the Board's rules relative to Disciplinary Proceedings LAC 46:LX. §1301, et seq., and in particular, LAC 46: LX. §1311, and applicable sections of the Louisiana Administrative Procedures Act, this Consent Order is entered into by the Board and Leslye Hunter on this the \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 2008.

I, Leslye Hunter, make these acknowledgments and waivers in support of a final disposition of the pending investigation of Complaint No. LPC/LMFT 06/07-10 by Consent Agreement and Order pursuant to La. R.S. §49:955D, in lieu of the institution and prosecution of formal administrative proceedings, and accordingly consent to the entirety of the Order set forth hereinabove and further waive any right to which I may be entitled under the Louisiana Administrative Procedure Act or any other law to contest, in any court, my agreement to this Order. By my subscription hereto, I also hereby authorize June Williams and Roxane Dufrene designated by the Board with respect hereto, as well as the legal counsel assisting, to present this Order to the Board for its consideration and to fully disclose to and discuss with the Board the nature and results of the investigation of this matter. I herein waive any objection to such disclosure based on due process of law under either the State or Federal Constitution or under State statutory law, including La.R.S. §49:960. I expressly acknowledge that the disclosure of such information to the Board by June Williams and Roxane Dufrene or their legal counsel shall be without prejudice to the prosecuting attorney's authority to file a formal Administrative Complaint, or the Board's capacity to adjudicate such Administrative Complaint, should the Board decline to approve this Consent Agreement and Order. I further acknowledge my awareness that should the Board approve this Consent Agreement and Order that the Order will be an Informal Consent Agreement and Order.
